FN—Black, with black top, broad white band with red tri-angle HL—Black with white line below bulwark level BT—Red SE, BS, BE and VS—White MS—Buff or stone half way up, then black DK—Buff or stone.

RE16 M.V. KONGO MARU—Cargo vessel. Y—1935 GT—7000
KS—16 1/2

FN—Black with black top, broad red dividing band edged white with letter "A" in white HL—Black BT—Red SE, BS and BE—White DK—Brown MS and DERRICKS—Cream VS—Cream inside red. Converted 1941, armed merchant cruiser, Imperial Japanese Navy.

RE17 S.S. CALCUTTA MARU—General cargo and passengers
Y—1917 GT—5300 KS—12

FN—Black with black top, broad dividing band white divided by two red lines HL—Black with white line below deck level BT—Red SE, BS and BE—White MS—Buff DK—Grey.

RE18 M.V. NOTO MARU—General cargo and Oil. Y—1935
GT—7300 KS—18.

FN—Black with black top, white broad dividing band with two red lines dividing HL—Black with white line below deck level BT—Red SE, BS and BE—White MS—Buff DK—Grey.

RE19 S.S. TOPAZ—Coastal trade. Y—1920 GT—600 KS—8

FN—All black HL—Black with short white band under bridge BT—Red SE, MS and BE—White BS—Black.

RE20 S.S. LONDON QUEEN—Coastal Trade and Passengers.
Y—1910 GT—600 KS—10

FN—Yellow with square, quartered white and blue HL Light grey top edged with white line BT—Red SE, BE—Brown wood BS—White MS—Brown.

RE21 M.V. COPELAND—Y—1946 GT—1250 KS—13

FN—All black HL—Black BT—Flesh SE—White DK—Stone MS—Buff BS—Black BE—Wood brown VS—Brown inside red.

RE22 S.S. FAIRHEAD (1948)—Passengers, cargo and cattle.
Y—1937 GT—1200 KS—12 1/2

FN—Black with white shield and red hand in centre, HL—All black BT—Red SE—White MS—Buff BS—White. Deck cranes black.

RE23 S.S. THOROVY—Tanker. Y—1893 GT—2700 KS—8

FN—Light grey with light grey top, white dividing band edged red with blue "C" shaped fish. HL—Gray with white band around top quarter of hull. BT—Red SE, MS and BS—White VS—White inside blue DK—Stone, tank tops white. Launched as the Snowflake in 1893 at Newcastle, this little tanker survived W.W.2, including the "Wolf Pack" attacks on Convoy SC7 North Atlantic 1940
